

Phra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya is located in the central region of Thailand. Ayutthaya is an ancient city rich in history and dotted with ancient heritage sites telling stories of its glorious and unique past. A trip to Ayutthaya is full of intriguing options to be enjoyed including educational activities and sightseeing choices fit for even the young ones in your family. The location is convenient, as it is not too far from Bangkok, and can easily be fit into a day's travel plans due to the convenient roads and transportation going to and from the area.





Family Route "Treasure Hunt in Ayutthaya"

Ayutthaya is a prime location for historical attraction sites; however, a trip to Ayutthaya offers much more than simply admiring ancient relics and objects well-kept in a museum. At Ayutthaya, one gets to explore the relics firsthand. There are many means of travelling around the sites comfortably including a cycling tour or a Tuk Tuk ride to hunt for "treasures" also known as the "treasures of Ayutthaya." Having been the capital city of Siam for 417 years, Ayutthaya has countless golden treasures hidden within her walls just waiting to be discovered by curious travellers.









Ayutthaya Historical Study Centre

The Ayutthaya Historical Study Centre is a great place to begin learning about the enchanting city of Ayutthaya. From the city map of Ayutthaya and exhibition zones, the Study Centre introduces visitors to what life was like during Ayutthaya's prime, and gets their imagination conjuring up an image of this glorious city before walking through the real historical sites to feel the aura of its presence for themselves.





Buddha Statue Head in Bodhi Tree Roots, Wat Mahathat

Once one steps inside the stone walls of Wat Mahathat, they will be immediately immersed by the grandeur of the temple. The relics of the principal pagoda in the Khmer style, as well as the nearby praying and assembly hall, tell us that this was once a significant location and centre of spirituality for the Ayutthaya people. Wat Mahathat housed the Lord Buddha's relics and was used as a venue for performing royal ceremonies prior to being changed to Wat Phra Si Sanphet which was restructured to accommodate the royal ceremonies.

In front of the small wihan (image hall) lies nature's work of art, a Buddha statue head entwined in the roots of a giant Bodhi tree, this truly one-of-a-kind nature-made sculpture has made the temple a hot spot for travellers to check out.



Follow the Phra Prang Treasure to the Chao Sam Phraya National Museum

Enjoy being dazzled by the glittering ancient gold valuables and artefacts from the past. The Museum showcases treasures; such as, utensils, clothing, swords, crowns, Buddha statues and valuable belongings of royal family members. The details and intricacy of these valuable artefacts reflect the skills of the goldsmiths in ancient times. Other archaeological objects dating back to the period of Dvaravati, Srivijaya, Lop Buri, Chiang Saen, Sukhothai, U-thong, Ayutthaya and Rattanakosin are showcased here as well.



Passing through Phra Prang and Treasure Hunting at Wat Ratchaburana


Walk past Wat Mahathat to the entrance of the nearby compound of Wat Ratchaburana to take a look at the Phra Prang (a pagoda-like construction) majestically standing inside. The Phra Prang was built during the early Ayutthaya period. The treasure vault of Phra Prang became famous when it was secretly unearthed in 1956.

Children and adults alike enjoy ducking inside the base of the Phra Prang as if they were on a treasure-hunting mission. The space below is divided into 3 rooms vertically, each of which was excavated by the Fine Arts Department, who uncovered a lot of ancient gold. These treasures were later kept at the Chao Sam Phraya National Museum.

In addition to gold ornaments, Buddha statues made of silver, gold, and copper as well as Buddha amulets were also discovered.

The uncovered treasures from the underground vault of the Phra Prang are linked to the ancient beliefs that the area strongly signifies a profound religious heritage. The belief is, that when Buddhism reaches its 5,000th year, the area will collapse. However, if the treasure survives, the existence of Buddhism in the area will be confirmed.





Visit the Largest Wihan and Singha Pagoda at Wat Thammikarat

A large bronze Buddha head replica is situated in the main assembly hall and takes up the space of nine rooms of Wat Thammikarat, one can only imagine how massive the entire Buddha statue would have been in the past when the main assembly hall housed the giant Buddha statue. What remains is only the Buddha's head, crafted in a U-thong style and made of bronze. From this evidence, we can assume that this temple was built prior to the foundation of Ayutthaya as the capital city. One should also be sure not to miss the Chedi Singha which is the main chedi of the temple. The shape of an upside down bell follows a Ceylonese style which was built in the reign of King Prasatthong in the late Ayutthaya period and was influenced by the Khmer style.

The Buddha Statue of Wat Na Phra Men

The Buddha statue of Wat Na Phra Men is the only Buddha statue that survived the fire caused by Burmese troops. Situated in the ubosot (ordination hall) of Wat Na Phra Men, the Buddha statue is adorned in exquisite detail and reflects the artisans' commitment to beauty. The statue's name resonates the magic and miracle believed to protect the city and ward off enemies. The statue is clothed in the King's attire and is considered to be one of the most valuable artefacts. King Mangra of Burma used Wat Na Phra Men as his army base located just a short canal away from the palace, another reason why the temple survived the blaze set by the Burmese army during wartime when Ayutthaya lost its sovereignty for the second time.



Mural Paintings at Wat Suwandararam


Admire the mural paintings depicting the legend of King Naresuan the Great, a great king and warrior of Thailand. The painting illustrating his fight on elephant back shows the stories of wartime in exquisite detail and can make visitors feel as if they were witnessing the war played out before them with their own two eyes. The images of more than 100 angels were painted and positioned at separate levels and angles, creating an illusory effect as if the angels were actually floating in mid-air.

Family Activities



Elephant Ride in the Old City

Hop on an elephant's back and enjoy a sightseeing ride around the old city while admiring the stunningly beautiful archaeological sites of the ancient city of Ayutthaya. Elephant ride services are available at Wang Chang Ayutthaya Lae Paniat, located at the Ayutthaya Historical Park.

Tuk-tuk Ride

Take a ride on a tuk-tuk (three-wheeler) and enjoy the wind in your hair while taking in the atmosphere of the old city. Historical sites dot the city as well as the outskirts of the area. Being the signature mode of transport in Ayutthaya, the tuk-tuks here are unique in their design with front-ends resembling a frog's face.

Tram Ride

If you come with a big family, we recommend using a tram to go sightseeing around Ayutthaya. The vehicle takes after the ancient model once used in Bangkok. The option is ideal for a big family who are not up for a bicycle ride. The tram is also eco-friendly as it doesn't require petrol.

Cruising on the Chao Phraya River

Ayutthaya is an island encompassing three rivers; namely, the Pa Sak, Lop Buri and Chao Phraya Rivers, and is connected to many other canals as well. Water transportation is therefore a viable option for getting to know the city better. One can enjoy a boat ride around the island capital where more than 18 temples can be seen dotting the shorelines. A traditional riverside way of life can be seen and a nighttime tour is recommended as the aura of the area is especially enjoyable when the night lights come on like candles from nature.

Woven Silver Barb Mobile

Traditional beliefs suggest that if one hangs a fish-shaped silver barb ornament at a baby's crib, the baby will be obedient and receptive to teaching. Still to these days, the silver barb mobile made from palm leaves is a signature product and souvenir symbolising Ayutthaya. A visit to Bai Lan Pradit Shop and Pla Thong Shop located on U-thong Road is highly recommended; the place has been heralded for its craftsmanship for over 20 years and the area offers exquisitely neat and top quality products.

Ayothaya Floating Market

An eco-style trip to Ayothaya Floating Market is ideal for everyone in the family, as there is a wide variety of activities to be enjoyed by all; such as, shopping for signature products from each district of Ayutthaya, elephant rides, or joining a tour boat around the premises at Bt20 per head. The area features a canal running through its centre and the land is divided into 16 zones, each of which are named after districts in Ayutthaya. Wooden shophouses and stalls as well as boats offer food and products for visitors. The gorgeous scenery as a whole truly reflects the simple way of life Ayutthaya residents enjoy and the extent of their bond with the rivers of the area. Shows and performances are also available here.

Kong Khong Market

Enjoy shopping for local products, foods, snacks, toxin-free vegetables and fruits sold by shop vendors dressed in Thai traditional costumes. The name of the market "Kong Khong" (meaning 'bend over') comes from the olden days when shop vendors laid their products out for sale on the ground requiring visitors to bend forward in order to browse the products.

Bang Sai Royal Folk Arts & Crafts Centre

Is the hub of handicrafts distributed directly from manufacturers. Visitors can see the handicraft manufacturing process and other interesting areas in the compound; such as, the Arts and Crafts Village, Bird Garden, Fish sanctuary, etc. A small train is also available for taking visitors on a tour around the area.





Eastern Coastline Route To KO Chang Rayong, Chanthaburi, Trat

The eastern sea coast is only a few hours away from Bangkok and is abundant with areas of rich nature for travellers to stop by and take in be it the ocean, mountains, or fruit orchards. Travelling in the East has a little something to offer for everyone in your family.



Family estination

The final destination along this route is Ko Chang, a massive island frequented by tourists all year-round. Countless accommodation options are available for families and are fully equipped with plenty of conveniences to ensure your holiday is comfortable. One can rest assured that a trip to Ko Chang will provide a memorable experience for everyone in the family.

Family Routes Coastline routes: Rayong, Chanthaburi

The monsoons travelling from the Gulf of Thailand bring along with them plenty of moisture for the eastern soil and many local people living in these areas cultivate fruit orchards for a living. Thus, the eastern areas of Thailand are plentiful with tropical fruits. Tourists can enjoy the experience of working in an orchard, picking fruits by hand and tasting the seemingly endless supply of tasty tropical goodness. One can also experience the ways of the fishermens' life, enjoy fresh seafood at seaside restaurants and bring back processed seafood as souvenirs for loved ones at home. The area is also a gemstones hub and is considered to be one of the world's major gems exporting areas. The route from Rayong to Trat offers a wide range of attractions and seaside accommodation as well as fun activities for kids and adults alike.



Suan Supatra Land

Visitors are greeted with a 'welcome drink' of fresh juice before being taken on a tram to survey some 800 rai of fruit orchards growing more than 20 different types of fruits as well as rubber plants. The long rows of trees provide ample green shade making the on-the-road experience very pleasant and relaxing. Fresh fruits and seasonal fruits are available for visitors to try all year-round. Thai papaya salad and organic salads made fresh from the orchard ingredients are also served up to satisfy your taste buds. Visitors can also enjoy visiting the beekeeping farm and taste real wild honey while watching the busy bees at work.

Ban Phe Market

A popular fishing port with incredibly reasonable prices in Rayong where many visitors stop to buy seafood on their way back to the city. If one is lucky enough to swing by at the same time as the fishermen are unloading their catches of the day, one can see the sorting of shrimps, fish and shellfish right on the spot. Seashell souvenirs and fried durian are among some of the top items visitors choose to buy at the Ban Phe Market.

Rayong Aquarium

Enjoy a wide range of aquatic life at the Rayong Aquarium – an experience suitable for people of all ages and genders. Small children can learn about sea living forms while a positive conservation spirit is instilled into their young minds. The adults won't be left out, as they are sure to enjoy the pleasant sightings of the sea animals as well. Fossils of extinct sea animals are also showcased.

Scenic View on Khao Laem Ya

Two kilometres from Ban Phe lies a road stretching along the sea oak forest and providing travellers with cooling shade for some 5 kilometres. Drivers feel as if they have been captured in the embrace of these huge green trees.











Old City

Tha Luang quarter is an old riverside community situated along the Chanthabun River. Old buildings dotting both sides of the street allude to the glorious past of "Mueang Chan" (Chan City), which was once a trade hub for foreigners. The intriguing architecture in this area is influenced by both Chinese and Western art. The riverside community maintains a traditional way of life and mixes Thai, Chinese and Vietnamese culture together into an interesting blend. Visitors and families shouldn't pass up many of the traditional street foods here, as there are countless delightful delicacies just waiting to be tried.

The National Maritime Museum

Marine transportation was at one time a crucial component leading to Thailand's economic growth and along with the merchants' vessels came the influences of foreign cultures. The National Maritime Museum is the perfect place for a family to learn about the evolution of Thai sea trade based on underwater archaeology research. The exhibit room is located on the second floor of the building where one is sure to be dazzled by the life-sized Chinese junk ship (sailing vessel) that includes a full interior visitors can enter into. This impressive model will allow kids and adults alike to truly enjoy the experience of travelling back in time to the sea merchants heyday. Other types of vessels including warships and royal vessels used during battles and royal ceremonies are also on exhibit as well as underwater antiques and artefacts recovered from the depths of the sea.

The Museum is located in the Noen Wong Army Camp and is open from Wednesday to Sunday 9.00 a.m. -4.00 p.m. (the Museum is handicapped accessible) 6 km from Chanthaburi City.



Salacca Orchard in the Ancient Army Camp

Brick walls and forts seem to contain and keep the stories and history of this army camp, built during the period of King Rama III in order to fend off the Vietnamese army, safe within their walls. With its strategic location on the high plains, the camp was a perfect location for keeping a close eye on the mouth of the Chanthaburi River from a safe distance. However, in modern times, the name Noen Wong Army Camp is better known for its scrumptious "Noenwong salacca." It has been said that this fruit orchard has been around for over one hundred years and visitors can enjoy both the relics of the past as well as the fresh fruit orchard atmosphere as they travel through the camp.

Namtok Phlio This waterfall enjoys cool fresh water all year-round, allowing for an abundance of fish to be found swimming in the clear waters. The site is located 200 metres from the nature park and visitors can enjoy trekking along the nature trails while exploring the green ecosystem with family members.




Tha Son Beach Shore

Before entering the city of Trat, try your hand at the many fun naturebased activities available for families at the Mangrove Forest Resource Development Station, Ban Tha Son, Amphoe Khlung, Chanthaburi. This learning centre for ecotourism along the mangrove forests of the Welu River delta is full of fun and educational activities to be enjoyed. Take in the gorgeous fauna while strolling along the 2.1 kilometre long wooden bridge or cycling towards the sunset at dusk. The pleasant location is a great place for visitors looking to spot fireflies at nightfall without having to hop on a boat or sail during the night hours. Another activity not to be missed is a boat trip to catch sightings of the red-backed sea eagles abundant in the area. The boat trip departs only once per day at 4.00 p.m.



The fishermen villages lining the shores of Ko Chang are uber-touristy, but somehow manage to maintain an authentic way of life. These friendly villages and their inhabitants can provide learning opportunities for children and welcome you to spend some quality family time together while enjoying memorable moments that will last a lifetime. Ko Chang is an ideal choice for a long family holiday.





Fishermen's Village at Salak Phet Bay



The Fishermen's Village at Salak Phet Bay is the perfect place to begin your journey; from here, one can observe the traditional fishermen's way of life and gain an appreciation for this skillful occupation. The houses jut directly into the water as coconut orchards surround them from the back. One will feel right at home as fishermen uncles and aunties greet visitors with never-ending warm smiles. Some homes have been transformed into home-stay accommodation and are delighted to receive guests or tourists looking to spend a portion of their holiday living like a real fisherman.

Located 24 kilometres from the Ko Chang ferry pier and 30 kilometres from Sai Khao Beach.

Namtok Than Mayom

Walk approximately 500 metres into the fruit orchard and you will come across the first tier of the Namtok Than Mayom. The first tier is not too high and is safe to explore. The cool freshwater pool located at the front of the waterfall is the perfect spot for family camping and splish-splashing about.

Durian Orchard


Heading back from the Fishermen's Village and Namtok Than Mayom, one can't help but notice and enjoy the pleasant shade blanketing the roadside. The area is filled will fruit trees, including durian trees, that blanket the entire island. Visitors can feel free to walk in and ask for the permission of the owner to explore the durian orchard. Don't forget to taste this fruit's unforgettable flavour and purchase some of the local fruits to bring home as souvenirs for loved ones. Purchasing produce from the growers directly on site is the best way to support their businesses.

Namtok Khlong Phlu

Not far away from Khlong Phrao, the main road of Ko Chang diverts into a turn leading to Namtok Khlong Phlu. Travel down around this corner and one will come across bungalow-style accommodation ready to welcome visitors seeking an intimate experience with nature. Walk a little further past the welcoming clear pool and stream and one will discover an enchanting emerald-green waterfall that is a popular stop for visitors for good reason. During the rainy season, the waterfall enjoys high tides and is at the peak of its beauty. Officials from the Forestry Department are on watch to ensure tourists' safety.

Ko Chang Viewpoint

Before heading off to the south of Ko Chang, don't forget to stop by the viewpoint at Kai Bae Beach where one can enjoy the view of the seemingly endless sea stretching out before them dotted by nearby islands, or wait for nature's grand finale and take in an impressive view at sunset.

Bang Bao Village

Another colourful attraction of Ko Chang located at the furthest southern end of the island, Bang Bao Village is a large fishermen community one should definitely check out if time allows. The area is home to a convenient pier connecting the nearby islands that is bustling with people and shops from dusk till dawn. Fishing services are available as well as ample seafood stalls, handmade shops and restaurants well prepared to cater to everyone in the family.

Family Destinations

The East of Thailand is fully enriched with natural marine resources offering a dream destination for a family getaway. The seas that wash upon the eastern shores are equally enchanting and pleasing as those in the South, making a trip to the East a choice you won't soon regret.



Muko Mun

An archipelago near the coastline is an example of some of Mother Nature's best work; a gem of the Rayong sea, this cluster of islands consists of three premium destinations: Ko Man Nok, Ko Man Nai and Ko Man Klang.

Once you set foot on Ko Man Klang and Ko Man Nok you will feel as if you have landed on your own private beachfront, as there is only one choice of accommodation shared between the two gorgeous islands.

The islands are therefore incomparably peaceful and serene. The white sands are known to be the most beautiful in all of Rayong. If you and your family are looking for ultimate serenity, you have come to the right spot. The waters are crystal clear allowing the grains of sand to sparkle up from below and the seas are shallow providing a perfect and safe place for children to enjoy a refreshing splash. Adults will enjoy the fantastic snorkelling around the island as well as a leisurely hour-long stroll around the premise of Ko Man Nok's grounds.

Ko Man Nai is home to a sea turtle conservation station where children can enjoy learning about the turtle conservation efforts in Thailand and explore the sea turtles breeding ponds. The ocean is clear blue and there are plenty of shallow corals to be enjoyed. #Travel by boat from Ao Makham Pom Pier (45 kilometres from Rayong City), boat rental costs approximately 700-1,500 Baht. 


Ko Ngam

Ko Ngam is situated a short 200 metres from the south of Ko Chang and can be reached in 20 minutes from the Trat shore by speed boat. The island has been hailed as Ko Phi Phi of the Gulf of Thailand due to its curvy bay connected to a large sand dune. The sea waters are brilliantly blue and clear, encircling scattered islets formed by a mountain range allow for the pleasant area to remain undisturbed by the winds, providing a perfect play area for children and pleasant atmosphere for canoeing or fishing. There is only one resort on Ko Ngam which offers a panoramic landscape view where you can clearly spot several islands and islets; such as, Ko Chang, Ko Lao Ya and Ko Kut.









Ko Mak

Ko Mak is an island truly enriched with pure nature. The unpolluted air and complete peace and quiet are ready to welcome and embrace tourists with a comprehensive service package. With systematic and professional services in place from both business operators and the locals, everything seems to fall in place and run in perfect harmony on the shores of this gorgeous destination. High-quality accommodation is offered at reasonable prices and there are plenty of rooms to go around for everyone. The nature around the island radiates, as if it has somehow escaped the wave of tourists found in other tropical holiday destinations. One can swim right into the clear blue waters and watch as the fish dart back and forth. Trees are plentiful providing shade from the tropical rays making the atmosphere suitable for a leisurely cycle around the island to check out the islanders way of life, many of which sustain their livelihoods by tending to coconut orchards and fishing.

A boat service is available from Krom Luang Chumphon Pier (17 kilometres from Trat City near Laem Ngop Pier). Boat services depart twice a day from Bang Bao Pier on Ko Chang and the journey takes approximately 1.5 hours. Contact:



Ko Kut

Ko Kut is the last island on the eastern sea and is the fourth largest island of Muko Chang archipelago. There are several attractions worth checking out on these shores; such as, Namtok Khlong Chao where the waters run plentifully all year-round. The lower floor and pool of the falls creates a large pond perfect for swimming in and splashing about and the beach at Ko Kut is considered to be one of the most beautiful places in all of Thailand. The beaches found on the west side of the island; such as, Ao Yai Ki, Khlong Chao Beach, Ao Phrao Beach, Ao Ngam Kho, and Ao Bao are the definition of fine white sand and clear blue waters. 



DAY 1

Morning - Noon

- Leave Bangkok at 7.00 a.m. and travel on the route Rayong-Chanthaburi-Trat-Ko Chang (320 kilometres and about a 5 hour-ride)

- Visit en route local attractions between Rayong and Chanthaburi i.e. fruit orchards, aquarium, museum and enjoy a seafood meal at the fishermen's village (See Family Route) If guests choose to visit the Tha Son Mangrove Forest Resource Development Station in Khlung, Chanthaburi during November - May, they may need to take the full day or spend overnight if they wish to take a boat ride to see red-backed sea eagles in the evening.

<u>Afternoon</u>

- Arrive at the pier in late afternoon. Take a 30-40 minute ferry to Ko Chang and check-in at the hotel and relax.

- Dinner at Khlong Phrao Beach. Many restaurants offer a boat ride to see fireflies at nighttime.

DAY 2

Full day

- Visit and explore Ko Chang (See Family Route) and enjoy adventurous activities at Tree Top Adventure or scuba diving to see corals around Ko Chang (Full day). Wrap up the trip with a boat ride to see the largest mangrove forest of the island at Ao Salak Khok (see Family Activity)



Wat Phra Yai – the Famous Landmark on Ko Samui

A giant Buddha statue is housed on the summit of a hill located at the north end of Samui. The predominant landmark, built by the people of Ko Samui years ago, is captivating and can be clearly spotted from an aerial view. A visit to the giant Buddha statue is somewhat of a spiritual trip leading you closer to the Buddhist spirit of the Samui people. The Buddha statue is situated on an islet not far from Ko Samui and can be accessed easily by road. Countless flights of stairs lead you up to the Buddha statue situated on the top of the hill where tourists can take in the spectacular bay of Samui at sunset.





Samui is an island of coconuts if there ever was one. Islanders live on coconut plantations and produce top quality coconut products for generations. Despite evolving into somewhat of a touristy island, Ko Samui and its people still maintain the traditional occupation. Monkeys chip in and help out in the cultivation process. These friendly active monkeys can often be seen climbing up and down the coconut trees skillfully picking the coconuts living up to their reputation as skilled orchard workers.

The coconut picking skill is not, however, innate to monkeys. Every monkey is required to attend a training school in order to shed their wild ways and become skilled and domesticated creatures who can work well with humans. Bo Phut Monkey Training School offers training for baby monkeys and visitors are allowed to watch the training techniques while enjoying the cuteness of these lively and intelligent animals firsthand.





Fisherman Village

The end of Bo Phut Beach located on the east end of the island used to be the largest fishermen's community on Samui. The fishermen and fish sellers' homes still remain today even though the area has been tastefully transformed into a colourful night bazaar offering good restaurants and handicraft souvenir shops – there is a seamless blend between the past fishermen's way of life and the new civilisation.


Chaweng Beach




Kuan U Shrine

Ko Samui has been home to many different communities over the centuries. The first community that settled on Samui was the Hainan Chinese; arriving by boat, these seafaring people found the island to be a safe and pleasant shelter from the sea and the storm. The Hainan community is still alive and vibrant on Samui to this day.

The road cutting past the community located at the corner is naturally narrow, as the roads are lined by old wooden buildings preserved by the islanders. Tourists can enjoy spotting the beautiful and classic architecture of the wooden houses adorned with perforated wooden pieces.

The heart of the Hainan-Chinese community is located at the Kuan U Shrine (Chinese god of fortune). The shrine has been heralded within the community for centuries. The later generations of Hainan people renovated the shrine into an even grander and more artistically beautiful design. One interesting element of the shrine are a series of photos hanging on the wall depicting Ko Samui ancestors, reminiscent of a hall of fame illustrating the proud and prestigious history of the famed island.



Samui Butterfly Garden

The dream-like scenery of colourful butterflies flying in the garden is something to be experienced, and can be enjoyed at the Samui Butterfly Garden located in a rather secluded southern part of the island and encompassing more than 20 rai of land. The garden is full of flowers and plants providing a pleasant atmosphere for a walk with great viewpoint destinations, as well as rock and butterfly gardens where one can enjoy viewing the butterflies at close proximity. Children can play hide and seek with these winged beauties or watch caterpillars on the leaves. The Butterfly Museum is located inside and serves as a learning centre for children and interested adults.



Samui Aquarium & Tiger Zoo




Family Routes (Half - Full Day)

Khao Lak is located less than one hour from Phuket. Before crossing the mountains to enter the Khao Lak area, travellers will pass by Thap Lamu Pier – a bustling transit stop on the way to the Similan Islands. If you are under time constraints, a short excursion around Khao Lak can easily be arranged. Thap Lamu Pier is also home to the Thap Lamu Navy Base, a destination where tourists can visit the Sea Turtle Conservation Centre located inside a uniqueturtle-shaped building. The sea turtle exhibition is designed to educate visitors and the little ones in your family about the sea turtle species in a fun and easygoing manner while everyone enjoys viewing and visiting the baby sea turtles in the nursery.




The route next to Thap Lamu Pier leads to the Khao Lak-Lam Ru National Park. Nature trails facing the vast ocean are just awaiting exploration and visitors can keep their eyes peeled along the way to spot tiny and amazing sea creatures; such as, mudskippers.













"Pakarang Cape" is another peaceful corner of Khao Lak one should try not to miss. Visitors are often stunned by this somewhat magical site where countless corals washed up and accumulated on the shore have formed a massive, whitecoloured stone platform...a cool place to chill out in the late afternoon.

Do not miss out on a visit to Takua Pa old town, a city that was once a prosperous trade and mine hub some centuries ago. The town still maintains Sino-Portuguese architecture and "Khanom Tao So" a favourite local snack, is a symbol of Takua Pa that visitors cannot afford to skip.

If time allows, one can travel on a bit further towards the north and within less than an hour will have reached the beautiful Namtok Tham Nang. The site offers a pleasant, easily accessed short route for enjoying a 500 metre walk full of photogenic nature and pleasant views.



Family Destinations Beyond Khao Lak



Muko Similan-Ta Chai Tour (1-3 Days)

Situated about 70 kilometres from the coastline, the Muko Similan features pristine beaches and lush green forests. Tourists usually opt for a day-trip or 1N2D trip arranged from Thap Lamu Pier located near Khao Lak Beach.

Family Destination

Muko Similan National Park contains nine islands commonly referred to by their ordinal numbers, of which Island No 4 (Ko Si) and Island No 8 (Ko Paet) are the most popular. On Ko Paet, Ao Kueak Ma is claimed to be the most beautiful of all the beaches in the area, with a stone in a sailing boat shape standing tall at the end of the bay and creating the perfect backdrop for some holiday snapshots. Campsites and accommodation are available from the National Park Office.




Tourists can explore the beauty of the nature trails on Ko Si. and enjoy the deep jungle ecosystem that is truly exotic. Lan Kha Luang viewpoint offers access to a stunning bird's-eye view of the island. Tourists often prefer to stay overnight on Ko Si due to its fully equipped accommodation options and campsites. The island offers endless possibilities for nature exploration. Rare and exotic bird species; such as, the Nicobar dove and "Hen Crab," with its bright red body, bluish crab claws and a surprising sound reminiscent of a hen, are fun to seek out and enjoy during the night hours when these exotic beach creatures generally come out to find their prey. An overnight stay further provides a good opportunity for exploring the nightlife of this small slice of heaven.


One activity not to be missed is of course a diving session. Guided by scubacertified experts, visitors can try a day-trip or live-aboard diving trip. 

Muko Surin (1-3 Days)

Another family destination for beach lovers can be accessed via Khura Buri Pier, a main pier leading to Muko Surin. Although it is further from Khao Lak than Thap Lamu Pier, which leads to Muko Similan, the pleasant nature one can enjoy along the way will put you in a pleasant state of mind immediately.



Muko Surin is about the same distance from the main land as Muko Similan and the nature in the area is dutifully cared for by the Marine National Park. The nature underwater, on the beach or inland remains intact and pure. One distinctive feature of Muko Surin is a shallow coral line offering countless snorkelling points from north to south and many more locations for snorkelling enthusiasts to enjoy than the neighbouring Muko Similan.

The tourist information centre is located in Ao Chong Khat on the north end of Surin Islands. The national park offers accommodation as well as a beachside camping area. A pleasant and short nature route connects the area to a nearby bay known as Ao Mai Ngam where visitors can enjoy a quieter and more peaceful atmosphere and a truly unique campsite.





The main activity on the island is diving, for good reason. There are more than ten dive sites available that can be accessed very conveniently. The national park offers diving trips twice a day: morning and afternoon sessions. The dive sites rotate frequently allowing tourists to explore the underwater world as much as possible.





Muko Surin is located just some 60 kilometres off the coastline in Amphoe Khura Buri, Phang-nga. The nearest pier is Khura Buri and several tour companies operate speedboat services. Tour packages come in various options including day trips or overnight stays. Speedboat rides take approximately 1.5 hours and the expressboat about 2.5 hours. Tour packages can be purchased directly through travel agencies in Khao Lak and Phuket. Tour companies offer transfer services to Khura Buri Pier as well.

Lake above Chiao Lan Dam (Khao Sok National Park (2-3 Days))

Khao Sok is literally where the mountain meets the sea. A gorgeous strip of green forest runs parallel to the coastline and beckons your company, graced by the backdrop of the majestic Tenasserim Range that spans across many provinces, there aren't many views more intriguing. The monsoon weather brings humidity and moisture from the ocean to the forest. This route is ideal for nature-loving families as they can travel by the green to Khao Sok National Park.






If your family members are seeking a slightly more adventurous path, try Khao Sok National Park, a breathtaking area offering nature trails of all distances. Trekkers can enjoy a variety of plants and trees along the way; such as, the famous "Bua Phut" while the meandering streams and waterfalls add a cool feel to the journey. Visitors can choose to stay at the accommodation provided by the National Park or those offered by resorts and private companies near the park. If you are looking for something truly worth writing home about, some even offer treehouse-styled accommodation.

Tourists can enjoy visiting the lake located above Rajjaprabha Dam, a portion of Khao Sok National Park. The forest area was transformed into a lake following the construction of the dam, eventually providing what many claim to be the most stunning lake landscape view in all of Thailand. From a house raft or a boat cruise, visitors can enjoy the impressive lake view all day long.

Activities include canoeing and kayaking in the lake or streams and elephant rides into the woods are also available.






